Artist in Residency

What: Crazy Horse Memorial® invites Native artists, musicians, writers, and culture bearers to apply for the **Artist in Residency** program. Selected artists receive one month of studio space, lodging, and time to complete a proposed creative or research project while sharing their work with visitors through demonstrations, conversations, workshops, or other public engagement in the Native American Educational and Cultural Center® (NAECC).

Who: Native artists, storytellers, musicians, writers, and culture bearers are encouraged to apply. Eligible applicants must be members of a federally recognized tribe, a state-recognized tribe, or certified as Indian artisans under the Indian Arts and Crafts Act. Applicants should be comfortable sharing their creative process, cultural knowledge, and project goals with visitors.

Describe your work and skills:

When: Residencies are offered May through September in one-month sessions. Artists may apply for more than one session, but selected artists will be assigned to one residency period. Artists are expected to be present at the Cultural Center at least 120 hours during the month, which may include studio work, visitor interaction, and sales.

Where: The Native American Educational and Cultural Center® (NAECC), at Crazy Horse Memorial®, Crazy Horse, SD. Studio space includes tables, chairs, basic electrical access, modular panels, and display lighting. Artists may bring table coverings, display racks, tools, or other items needed for their work.

Stipend and Requirements: Accepted artists will receive a \$3,000 stipend, lodging, daily lunch at the Laughing Water Restaurant, and studio space. Artists must maintain an open

studio where visitors can observe their work and ask questions. Artists may sell original artwork, but the focus of the program is cultural sharing, creative work, and research. Items offered for sale must include a tag of authenticity with the artist's name, tribe, date completed, and materials used.

Cancellation: Accepted artists must notify the Cultural Programs Manager on or before March 28, 2027, if they are unable to participate. Late notification, failure to appear, or failure to complete the residency as agreed may affect future acceptance into the program.

Proposal and Images: Please submit a 1–2 page proposal describing the residency project, research goals, work to be demonstrated or sold, and how visitors may engage with your process. Include three high-resolution JPEG images with the emailed application.
